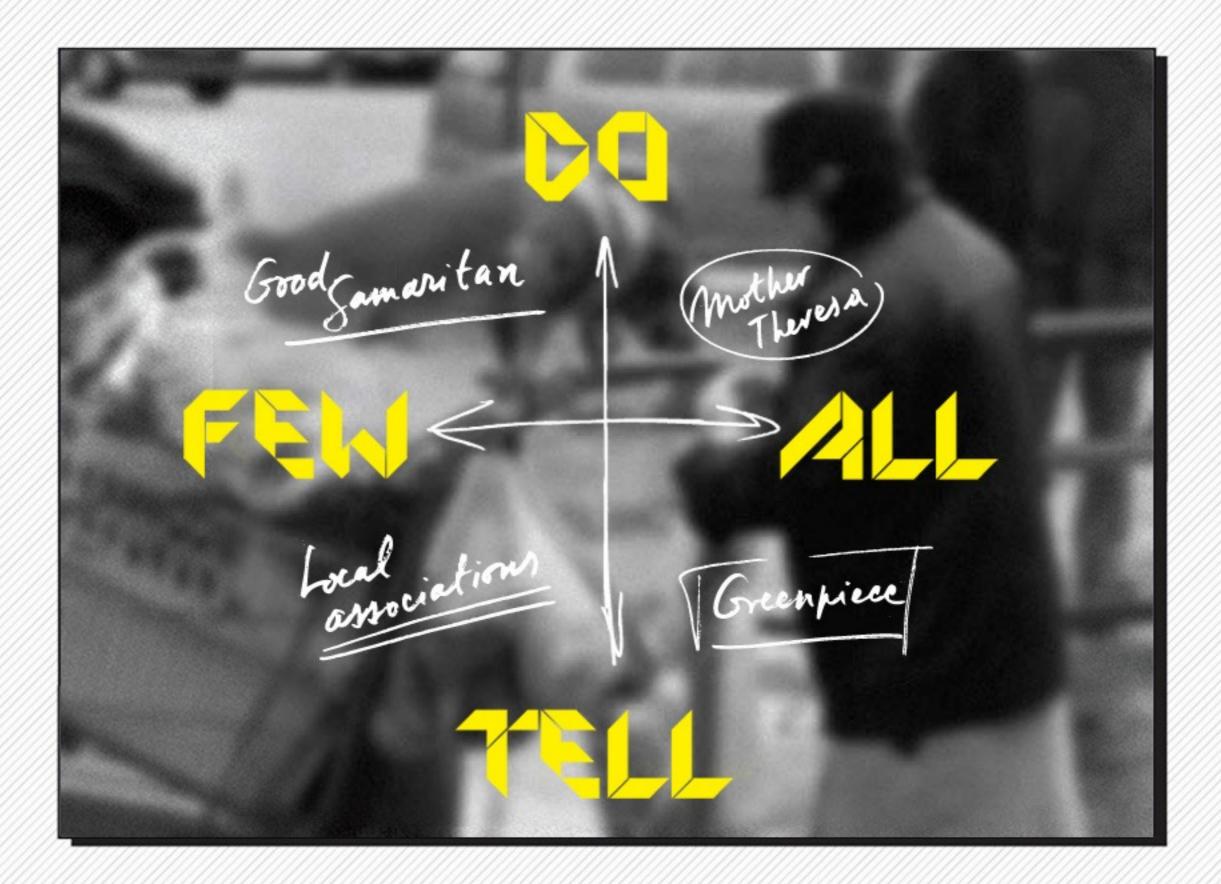
even the homeless.

Some people want to help a few people they know.



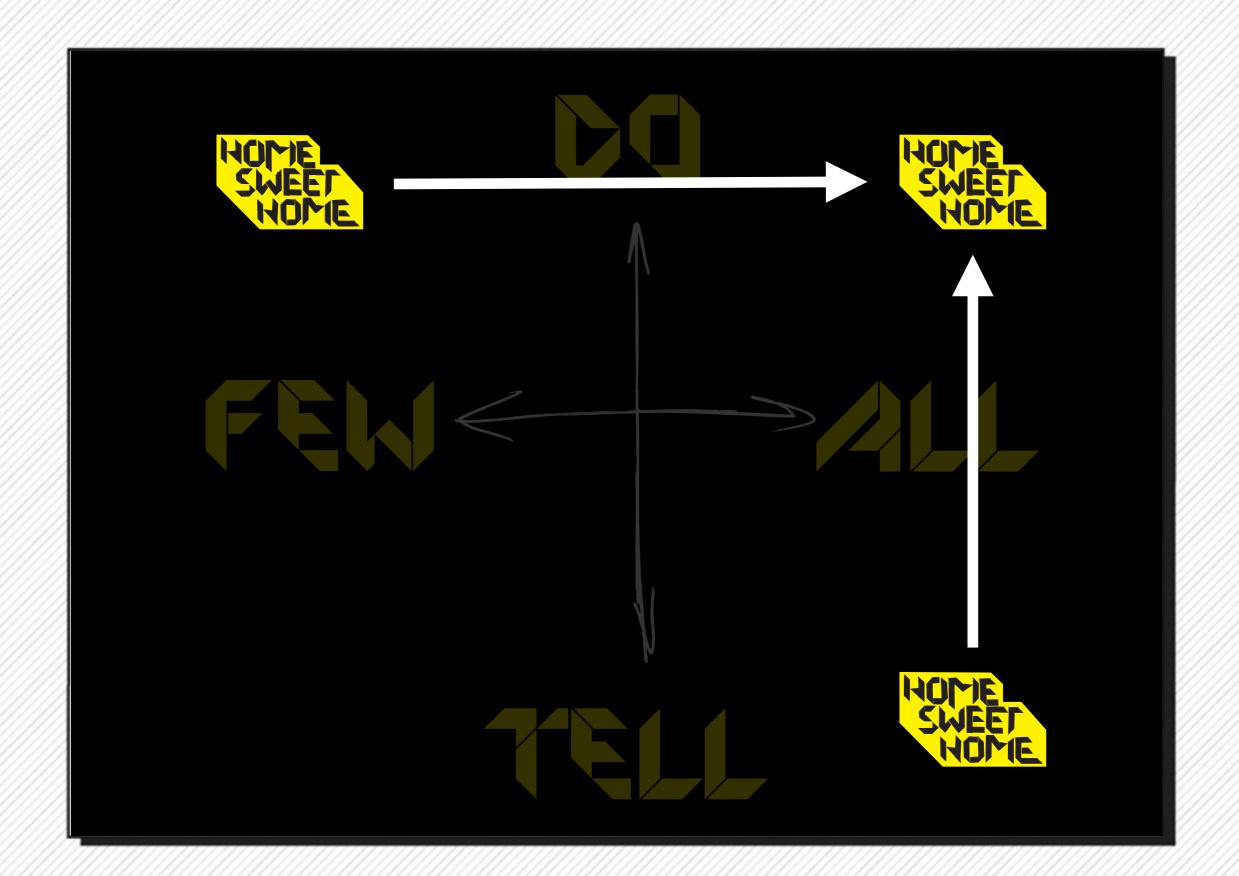

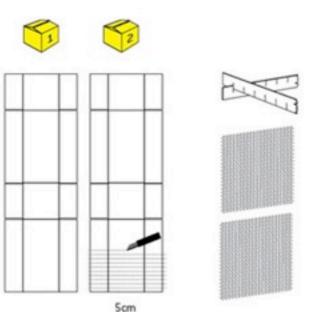


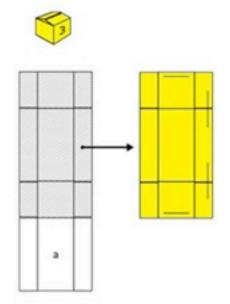
- different "models" of cardboard shelters
- installed in the top tourist spots
- Characteristics of all cardboard house models:
- made minimalistically from cardboard boxes:
 no sticking, cutting only
- easy to make: all that is needed is cardboard boxes (number of boxes depends on the "house model") and a knife or scissors.
- easy to reassemble and move from place to place
- isolated from the ground and very stable

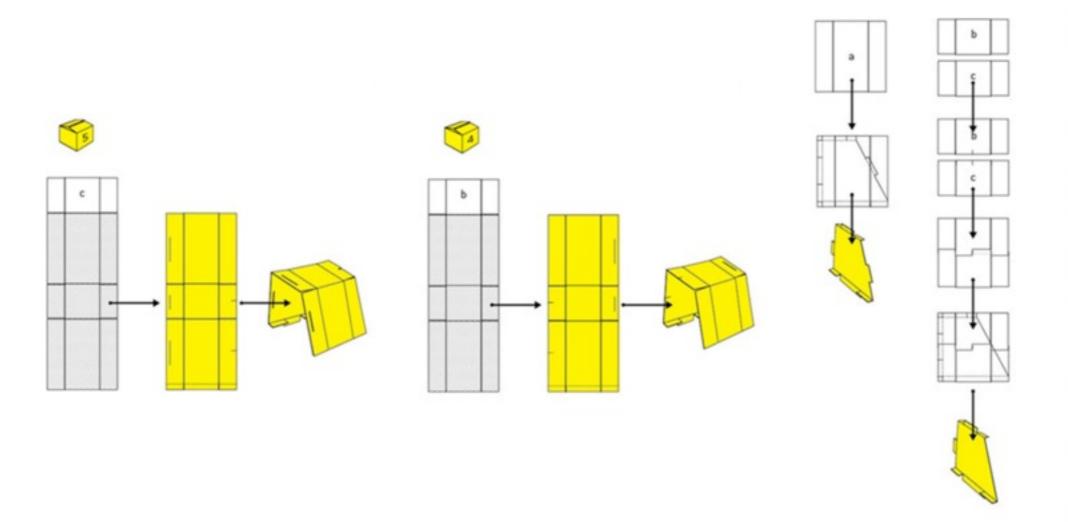






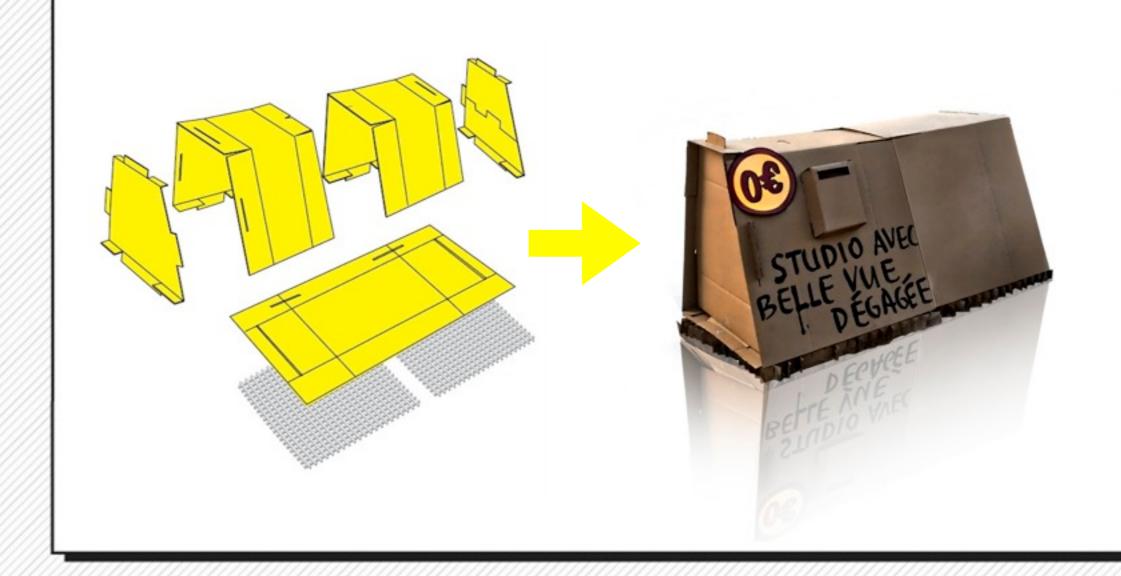

- in **print ads** looking like real estate ads

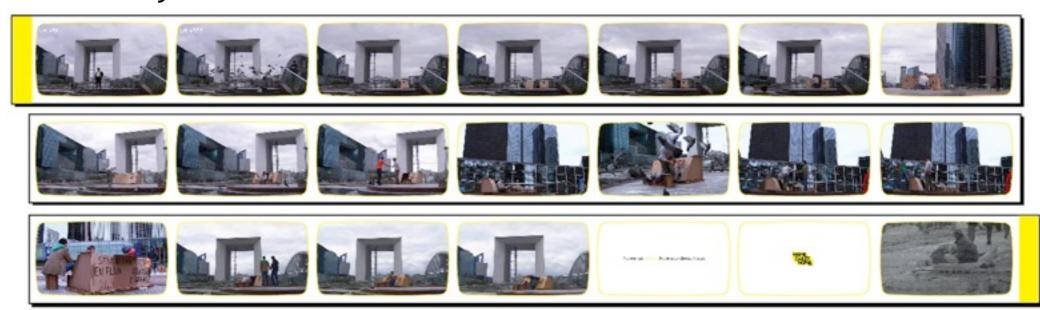

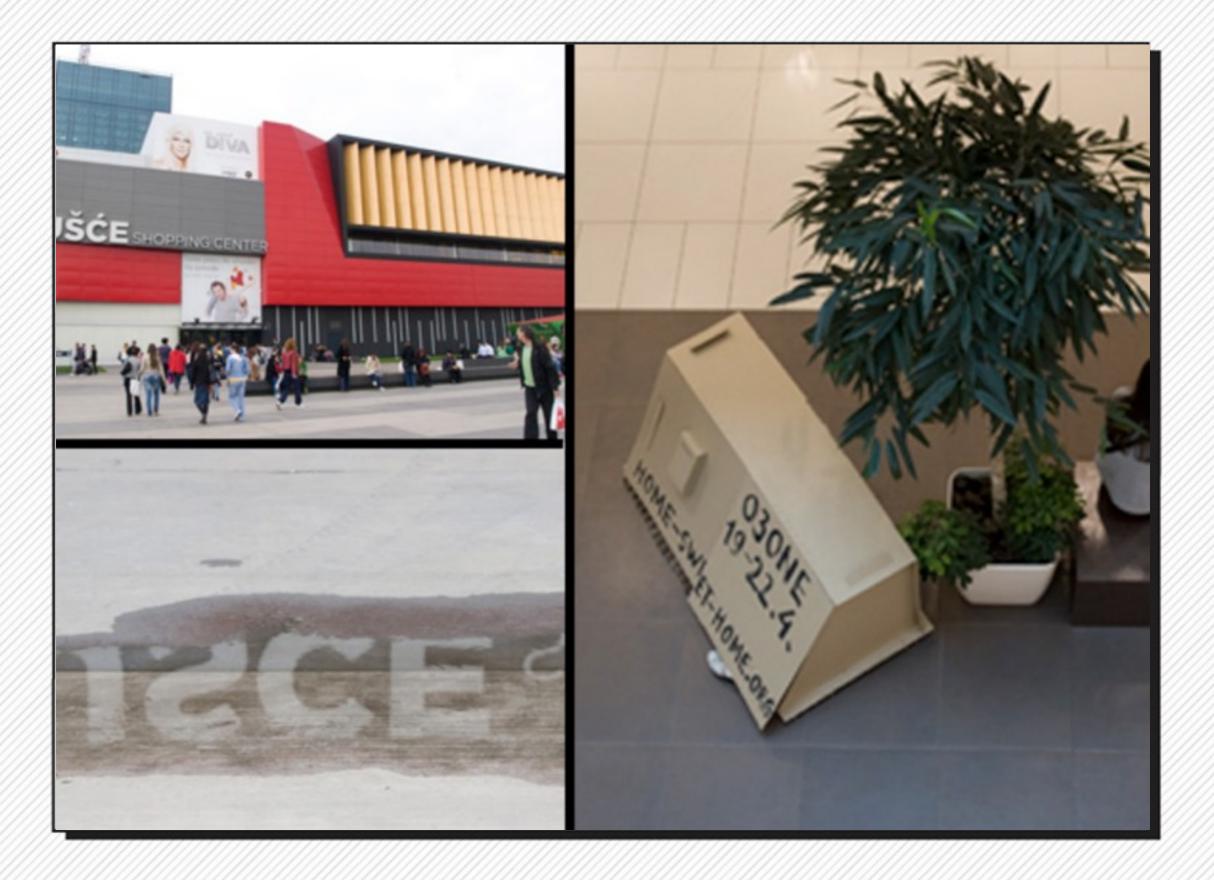


- manual presenting all the models and how to make them

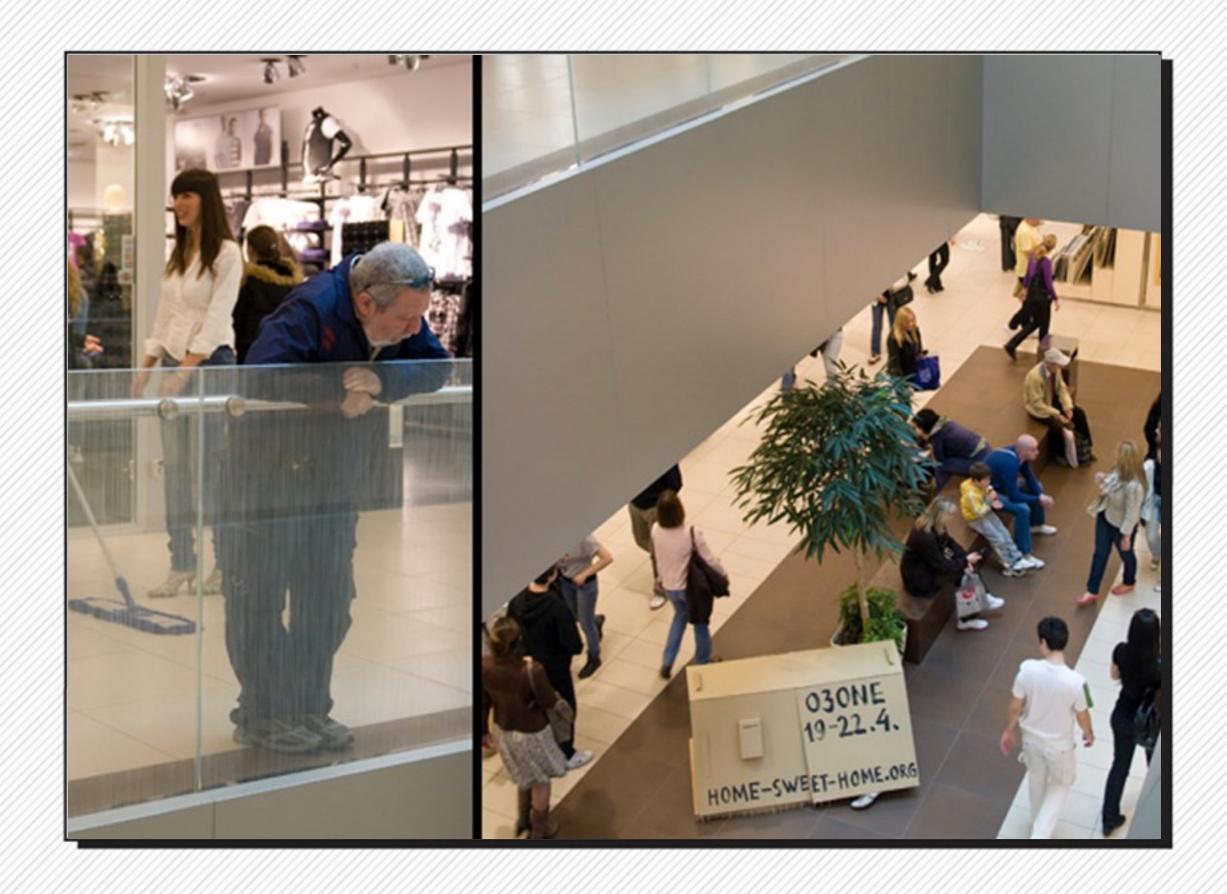

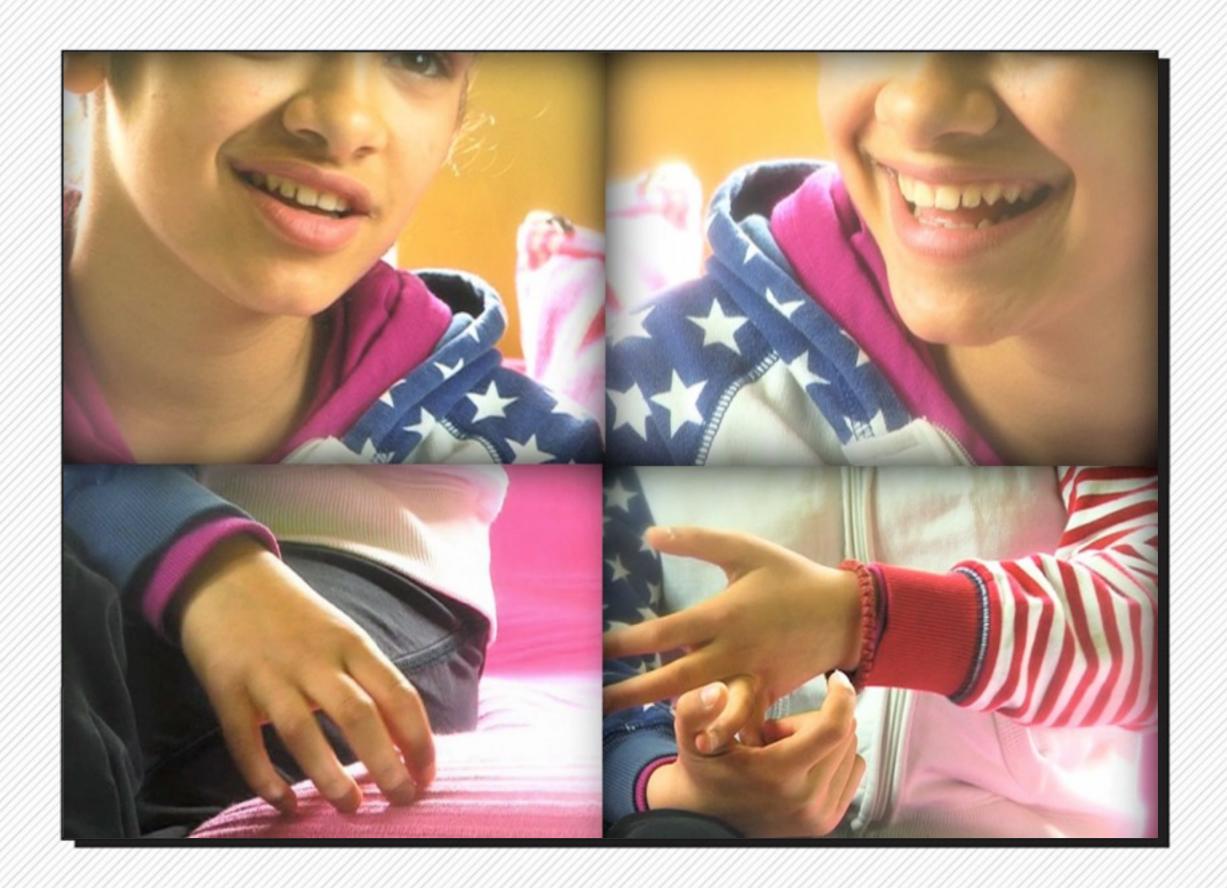
